After much delay due to the unforeseen challenges of the past year, I am happy to report that the newest issue of *Archival Issues* (volume 40, number 2) has gone to print. The issue features nine publication reviews and three articles on topics that include strategies for preserving and providing access to audiovisual recordings and educational outreach practice in medical archives. Please note that the US Postal Service is experiencing major delays in delivering mail, so it may be a while before print copies arrive in your mailbox. An ad hoc committee is being assembled and will convene soon to determine which authors from the last two years will receive this year's Margaret Cross Norton and New Author Awards. The selected award winners will be announced during the business meeting at the virtual MAC Annual Meeting in May.
